Randy Hendrickson of Crawfordsville Wins Lineworker Award

IMPA Hosts Third Annual Linemen Appreciation Event

Over 100 community leaders and utility workers from around the state joined to acknowledge these linemen, who consistently work to provide reliable electricity in their communities.

This year's event began with breakfast and an equipotential grounding training session led by IMPA Service Corp General Manager Jeff Vincent. Afterward, attendees spent time visiting dozens of vendors, participating in axe throwing and yard games, and networking with other utility employees from around the state.

They also consider economic development programs and incentives for business, including energy efficiency and renewable energy programs, marketing/ outreach, and rates. IMPA was selected for the honor based on the job creation and capital investment commitments

announced from project activity in 2022 within the IMPA service territory.

This year's designation is the fourth time that IMPA has been named a Top Utility in Economic Development over the last five years.

"IMPA is thrilled to be named as one of the top US utilities for economic development once again," commented Bryan Brackemyre, Vice President of Member Services for IMPA. "We take pride in working with our member communities to attract businesses and industries to help grow and strengthen their economic base and quality of place.
